Tim Richardson MP joined us for our assembly. He spoke to the students about the importance of the lands around our neighbourhood as they have been lived on by indigenous people for thousands of years. He



mentioned the meaning of some of our local place names: Mordialloc = Near the Little Sea,

Year 4 Excursion to Gould League

On Monday I went with the Year 4 students to their Gould League excursion. They were involved in a range of activities to gain a better understanding of their Unit of Inquiry. These included animal classification, food chains, habitat identification and composting. The students were engaged, made excellent contributions and asked thoughtful questions. The presenters commented on how good our students were throughout the day, which was fantastic feedback to receive.

Fathers' Day / Special Persons' Stall

NAPLAN

This week you would have been lucky to miss articles regarding how levels of student attainment have been slipping, based on the NAPLAN results. This year the results are hard to compare to previous years based on the assessments being completed so much earlier in the year and the recalibration of the results against four new proficiency standards. Dr David Howes, our Deputy Secretary, released a letter this week to schools stating how well Victoria has done when compared to other states. His letter can be found here: sharing this letter

Reduce Your Household Waste and Impact on the Enrvironment

A lot of the waste we create ends up unnecessarily finding itself in landfill.

As organic waste breaks down in landfill, greenhouse gases are created, massively contributing to global warming.

Here is a list of simple and cost effective ways to reduce the number of items going to landfill, and therefore protecting the health of our planet.

- Ditch the plastic wrap and tin foil. Try using bees-wax wraps, reusable plastic containers and washable sandwich pockets.
- Plan your meals for the week so that you are only buying what you need.
- Buy foods in bulk and separate into small containers for lunches. This is often cheaper than buying in smaller quantities.
- Choose loose, fresh foods that are not packaged in plastic—think individual fresh produce such as apples, carrots and potatoes.
- Sort your waste before disposal compost where possible, green waste, recycling.
- Buy second-hand items where possible and donate used goods to others in need or opportunity shops.
- Reuse school stationary from year to year

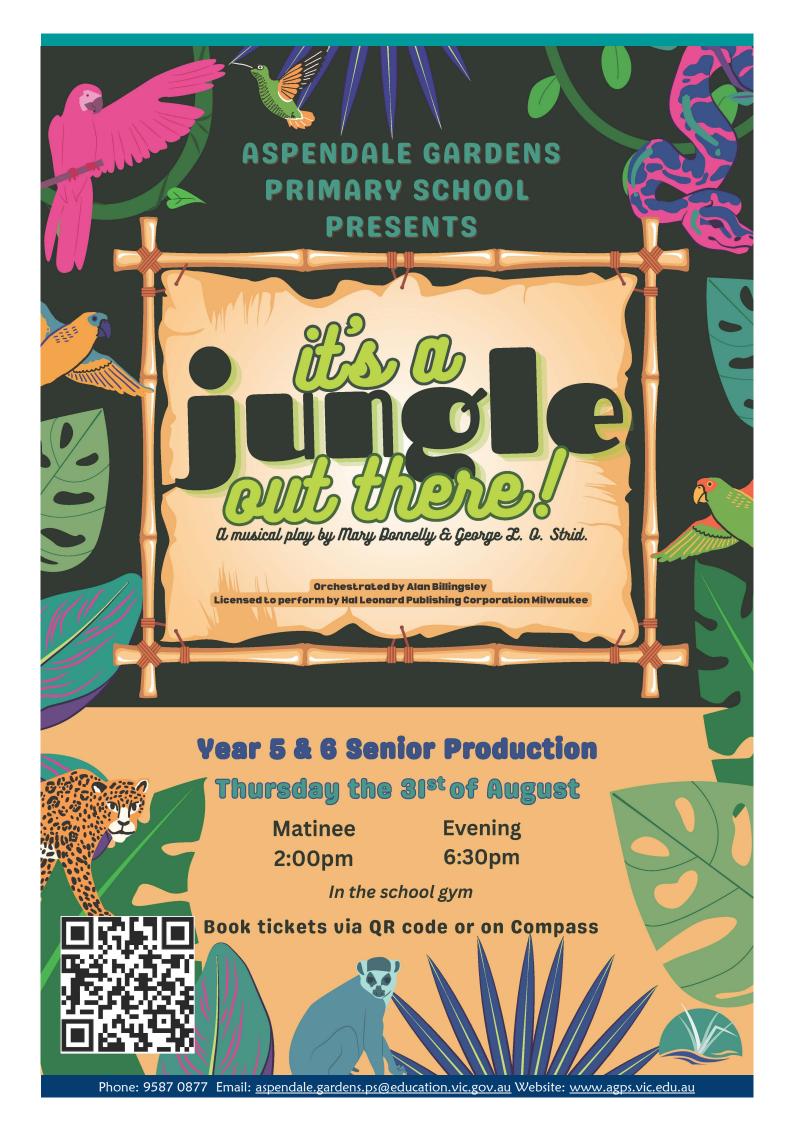



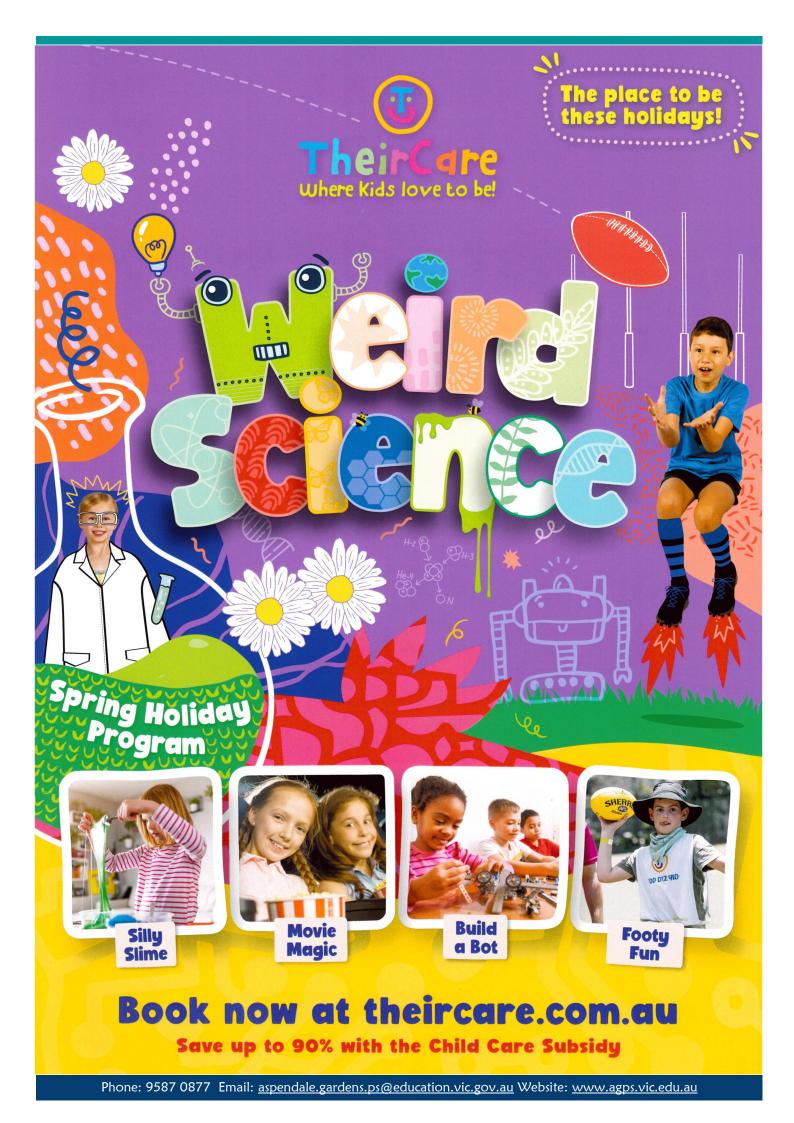

'Peaceful Kids' is a Mindfulness and Positive Psychology based program to lessen anxiety and stress and increase resilience in children. The program has been created to offer children a developmentally appropriate program that gives them the skills, practice and support to utilise coping strategies that lessen the symptoms of anxiety and stress.

Outcomes of the Peaceful Kids program:

- · Lessen symptoms of anxiety and stress in children
- · Teaches children to self-calm
- · Empowers children to manage their own anxiety and stress symptoms
- · Builds emotional resilience
- · Develops emotional intelligence skills
- · Teaches children life-long skills to manage stress and prevent stress build up
- · Supports children so they know that they are not alone with suffering from anxiety

Program structure and fees:

- · Foundation: 5 week program (60 mins each week). 4-6 students in each group.
- · Years 1-6: 8 week program (60 mins each week). 4-6 students in each group.
- · Sessions are run during class time (not during specialist classes).
- \cdot Cost: \$200 (Foundation) \$270 (Years 1-6). This includes all materials for the 5/8 week program and weekly emails to parents.
- · 10% discount for siblings and returning students.

This program would suit:

- \cdot Children who get stressed easily and/or have anxiety.
- \cdot Children who find controlling their emotions difficult.
- · Any child who would like to learn more about mindfulness.
- · If you are not sure, please contact me to discuss if the program would suit your child or ask your teacher!


