#### FROM OUR ACTING PRINCIPAL

Being the first day of winter, it is a timely reminder for our students to attend school with the appropriate clothing, suitable for colder days. Please have a look at the uniform policy on the website to see our winter uniform. It has been excellent to see a number of our students wearing the AGPS beanie whilst outside on cold days.

I met up with some very excited Foundation students on Wednesday as they returned from the Moonlit Sanctuary. Their excursion engaged the students and got them thinking about the physical characteristics of animals. The students were keen to tell me about the native animals they saw and learnt more about. The list included Tasmanian devils, dingoes, kangaroos, koalas, snakes, lizards and parrots.

#### Parent Teacher Meetings

We will be opening up the Compass portal for parents to book times to attend the Parent Teacher Meetings. Our Parent Teacher Meetings will be held in the final week of the term on Monday 19th June and Wednesday 21st June.

These will follow the release of the end of semester reports, which will be available on Compass on Thursday 15th June. During the meetings, teachers will answer any questions related to the reports and will also share the students' future learning goals.

#### Lunchtime Clubs

We provide a number of clubs and lunchtime activities for the students to get involved in during lunchtimes.

The library is available for students to read our wide variety of books or share a book with a friend. Friendship Club is run in the CLC, which provides students a place to do craft activities, construction and board games. There are also a number of other clubs available for students to attend during the lunch break. These include dance, chess, robotics, drawing, gardening and choirs. It is excellent to see so many students broadening their experiences and having fun during these activities.

#### Chinese Week



This week we enjoyed a range of activities to celebrate our Chinese Week. On Tuesday and Thursday lunchtimes, we ran the finals of our Master Chef competition. Four groups of students planned their recipes and cooked in front of a live audience. The judges then tasted the foods that were presented and winners were selected. To

celebrate the Year of the Rabbit, our younger students were involved in bunny hopping races at lunchtime. This was most entertaining and was enjoyed by the students. We look forward to more celebrations at our assembly on Friday.

#### Sorry Day

National Sorry Day is a day to acknowledge the strength of Stolen Generations Survivors and reflect on how we can all play a part in the healing process for our people and nation. While this date carries great significance for the Stolen Generations and other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, it is also commemorated by Australians right around the country. Last week our Year 6s selected Indigenous inspired picture story books to read to the students in different classes. This was a great experience for our older students and was enjoyed by the younger year levels. We also received Acknowledgement of Country window stickers from Kingston Council that we have displayed in our school entrance area and our gym entrance. In Week 8 we will be

#### **ANNUAL SCHOOL DISCO**

Hello Parents, Guardians & Friends,

Get excited as Friday 16th June 2023 is the date for our annual School Disco!

As a team we thought that we would provide you with some key information relating to the disco in case you are a 'first timer' or aren't 100% sure how it all works:

- The Junior Disco (Foundation to Year 2) runs from 5:45pm to 7:00pm and the Senior Disco (Years 3 to 6) is from 7:30pm to 9:00pm.
- All children will be provided with a numbered wristband prior to the event. It is <u>really important</u>
  that your child is wearing it when they arrive. We want to reduce the amount of time the
  children are stood outside on a winter's night and numbered wristbands allow us to check them
  in quickly.
- Parents are more than welcome to stay with their child/ren. If you do stay, make sure you head over to the designated adult area so that the dance floor is free for the children.
- Parents can drop their child/ren off and collect them at the end of their session. We have a lot of
  volunteers that keep an eye on the children, and we will always call a parent to collect their
  child, if the need arises.
- If we do call for you to collect your child, it would be appreciated if you collect them as soon
  as possible. (It is always a familiar face or a hug from a special person that makes them feel
  better).
- No child will be allowed to leave either disco without a parent, guardian or other responsible adult collecting them. We will have a system in place to make sure this happens.
- Pick up procedure at the end of both the Junior and Senior Discos all students will wait inside
  the gym to be collected by their parents/carers. Each year level will have their own collection
  point which will be designated by wall signs and attended by parent volunteers to ensure a
  smooth process.
- We have fully qualified first aiders at the event to keep everyone safe.
- There will be an array of glo products available to purchase on the night as well as chips, chocolate and water so please make sure your child has some change if they wish to make purchases.
- Please note that we will not be able to provide a refund for a glo product/s that was broken or damaged whilst being used for a purpose, other than intended!
- Your child is encouraged to bring their own water bottle. Please make sure it is clearly labelled with their name.

#### **Volunteers**

- The event needs numerous volunteers to make it a success. If you do kindly volunteer, previous experience tells us that it's not possible to help at the event while looking after your own child/ren. So, if you do want to help, please make sure you are comfortable with your child bopping to Rick Astley with their friends!
- You will need to have completed our Volunteers Agreement (accessible from the office or on our website) and have a current Working With Children Check (WWCC).
- You will be given a specific role and briefed on what is involved. You will be part of a team and not left on your own!

This event is one of the staples on the fundraising team calendar. We had nearly 75% of the school attend the disco in 2022 and it is a brilliant event that is loved by everyone.

We hope that this information is helpful and we are looking forward to a really successful night.

### **PYP Focus in Year 1**

In Year 1, our current Unit of Inquiry is 'Where we are in place in time' with a focus on 'how changes over time influence who we are and how we live today'.

In their classrooms children explored objects that were used in the past and tried to predict what they were used for. It was interesting to see all the creative responses our students came up with.

During Week 5 the students enjoyed travelling back in time with our Year 1 'Schools of the Past' Dress-up Day, and incursion with Mrs.Sargood. They practiced activities such as cursive hand writing using ink and played games such as duck duck goose, hop scotch, sack races and egg and spoon races.











During Buddies students took an 'olden day' toy and recreate it so that it fits in the modern day world. Exploring the idea - What could you add to make it more modern? You can redesign, but it still needs to be recognisable as the original.

As we finish our unit throughout this term we will be creating and presenting personal timelines of changes in our own lives and also interview our Grandparents to learn about changes they have experienced in their own lifetime.

In 2012 my family travelled with my Cambodian- born husband back to Cambodia after he'd lived in Australia for 35 years. The trip was an eye- opening experience. In response, in 2015 we set up our charity 'Have a Heart for Cambodia'. Our vision is to make a difference to the lives of hundreds of disadvantaged young people in Cambodia.

Through a variety of Special Events such as movie screenings and dining experiences we are raising funds to support the organization, ODA (Opportunities of Development Thru Art) in Siem Reap. 'Individually we are one drop, Together, we are an ocean.'

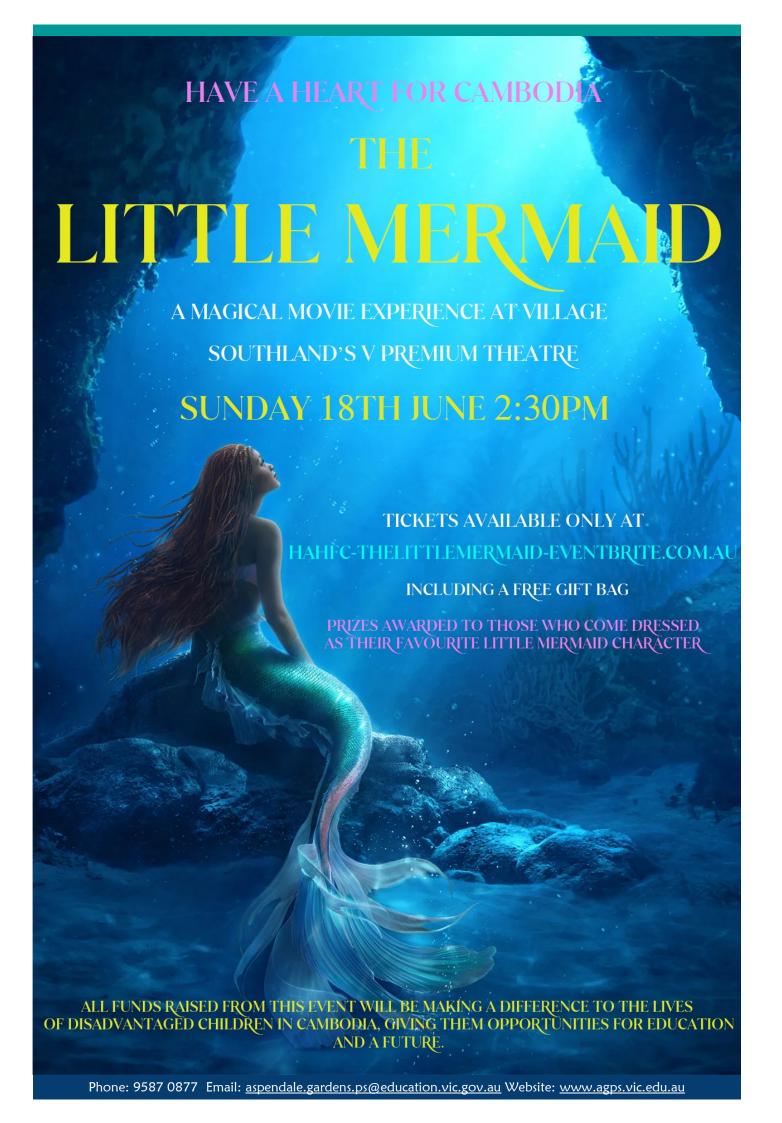












## TERM 3 PEACEFUL KIDS EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST ARE OPEN!

'Peaceful Kids' is a Mindfulness and Positive Psychology based program to lessen anxiety and stress and increase resilience in children. The program has been created to offer children a developmentally appropriate program that gives them the skills, practice and support to utilise coping strategies that lessen the symptoms of anxiety and stress.

#### Outcomes of the Peaceful Kids program:

- · Lessen symptoms of anxiety and stress in children
- · Teaches children to self-calm
- · Empowers children to manage their own anxiety and stress symptoms
- · Builds emotional resilience
- · Develops emotional intelligence skills
- · Teaches children life-long skills to manage stress and prevent stress build up
- · Supports children so they know that they are not alone with suffering from anxiety

#### **Program structure and fees:**

- · Foundation: 5 week program (60 mins each week). 4-6 students in each group.
- · Years 1-6: 8 week program (60 mins each week). 4-6 students in each group.
- · Sessions are run during class time (not during specialist classes).
- $\cdot$  Cost: \$200 (Foundation) \$270 (Years 1-6). This includes all materials for the 5/8 week program and weekly emails to parents.
- $\cdot$  10% discount for siblings and returning students.

#### This program would suit:

- $\cdot$  Children who get stressed easily and/or have anxiety.
- $\cdot$  Children who find controlling their emotions difficult.
- · Any child who would like to learn more about mindfulness.
- · If you are not sure, please contact me to discuss if the program would suit your child or ask your teacher!

#### **Wonder Recycling Rewards Program**

During Term 2, AGPS will be taking part in the Wonder Recycling Rewards program. This program is coordinated by bread manufacturing company 'Wonder' and is designed to assist with recycling the many tonnes of bread bags that are thrown into landfill each year.

In return for collecting and recycling bread bags, schools participating in the program will be rewarded with a range of brand new sports equipment for students of all year levels to enjoy. **The more bread bags we collect for recycling, the more sports equipment we will earn!** 

Our collected bread bags will be returned to Wonder late in Term 3 and our sports equipment will be sent out towards the end of the year.

Here is some further information about the program:

#### Where do I drop my bread bags?

A collection box will be located in the AGPS office for students, their families and staff to drop off their bread bags from the beginning of Term 2.

#### What is classified as a bread bag?

The rule of thumb is that if it has contained bread of some sort and is a soft plastic, then it's a bread bag. If it hasn't contained bread, then it's not a bread bag.

#### Do our bread bags need to be clean?

Bread bags should be as free from crumbs as they can be to keep the recycling process free from contamination (there is no need to wash them).

#### How are the bread bags recycled once we have collected them?

Our recycling partner APR Plastics manages the recycling process for us. APR Plastics empty the cartons and recycle the boxes. The plastic is then processed into an oil that can be reused to create food grade packaging, creating a circular economy.

Unfortunately the cardboard bread tags are not included as part of the Wonder Recycling Rewards program, but they can be recycled from home. To ensure your bread tags are properly recycled, pop them in a used paper envelope that's folded shut before throwing them in the paper recycling bin.

So let's all do our part to help protect our planet and earn some new sporting equipment for our school. Collect your bread bags at home and bring them to school to drop in the box.

It's as easy as that!
