#### End of Semester Reports and Parent Teacher Meetings

Our end of Semester One student reports will be released on Compass today (Thursday 15th June) at 3:45pm. To access the reports, login to your Compass account and select 'Your Child'—Click on 'View Academic Reports' then select 'Semester 1 2023'.

The Compass portal for parents to book times to attend the Parent Teacher Meetings will remain open until Monday morning @ 9:00am. Our Parent Teacher Meetings will be held in the final week of the term on Monday 19th June from 3:45pm—6:00pm and Wednesday 21st June from 3:45pm—7:30pm. During the meetings, teachers will answer any questions related to the reports and will also share the students' future learning goals.

#### **NAIDOC** Week

Our school was decorated with some of our amazing indigenous artwork. This included the word, 'Wominjeka'. This means 'To come with purpose' or more commonly 'Welcome' in the Woiwurrung language of the Wurundjeri people.

Unfortunately, due to illness, some of our NAIDOC Week activities were not able to run as







we had hoped. These activities will be re-schedule in Term 3, as will our NAIDOC Week assembly.

#### School Improvement

Each year we prepare an Annual Implementation plan which involves strategically setting goals and actions for improvement at our school. A part of this is to use the opinions of our students, parents and staff. The students in Years 4, 5 and 6 have just completed their Attitudes To School Survey, which gives us important information about their perceptions of our curriculum, our teachers, our class / school culture.

#### Attitudes To School Survey Results, linked to our Annual Implementation Plan 2023 Goals

To increase the percent positive responses score on Attitude To School Survey for the following factors:

•	Classroom behaviour from 74% in 2022 to 76%	Result = $78\%$
•	Teacher concern from 70% in 2022 to 72%	Result = 72%
•	Emotional awareness and regulation from 67% in 2022 to 69%	Result = 70%
•	Respect for diversity from 71% in 2022 to 73%	Result = 77%
•	Student Voice and Agency from 68% to 70%	Result = $69\%$



These are a promising set of results from our students. We will be analysing the full set of data over the coming weeks and identify trends within the school and within cohorts. This week the students across the whole school will have an opportunity to give us further feedback based on their perceptions of the learning in their class and then later in the year will give us feedback on aspects concerning the wider school. The staff and parent surveys will be completed in Term 3.


# **PYP Focus in Year 4**


Where We Are in Place and Time Central Idea: Exploration leads to new discoveries, opportunities and understandings.








In 2012 my family travelled with my Cambodian- born husband back to Cambodia after he'd lived in Australia for 35 years. The trip was an eye- opening experience. In response, in 2015 we set up our charity 'Have a Heart for Cambodia'. Our vision is to make a difference to the lives of hundreds of disadvantaged young people in Cambodia.

Through a variety of Special Events such as movie screenings and dining experiences we are raising funds to support the organization, ODA (Opportunities of Development Thru Art) in Siem Reap. 'Individually we are one drop, Together, we are an ocean.'





# **Wonder Recycling Rewards Program**

During Term 2, AGPS will be taking part in the Wonder Recycling Rewards program. This program is coordinated by bread manufacturing company 'Wonder' and is designed to assist with recycling the many tonnes of bread bags that are thrown into landfill each year.

In return for collecting and recycling bread bags, schools participating in the program will be rewarded with a range of brand new sports equipment for students of all year levels to enjoy. **The more bread bags we collect for recycling, the more sports equipment we will earn!** 

Our collected bread bags will be returned to Wonder late in Term 3 and our sports equipment will be sent out towards the end of the year.

Here is some further information about the program:

#### Where do I drop my bread bags?

A collection box will be located in the AGPS office for students, their families and staff to drop off their bread bags from the beginning of Term 2.

#### What is classified as a bread bag?

The rule of thumb is that if it has contained bread of some sort and is a soft plastic, then it's a bread bag. If it hasn't contained bread, then it's not a bread bag.

#### Do our bread bags need to be clean?

Bread bags should be as free from crumbs as they can be to keep the recycling process free from contamination (there is no need to wash them).

#### How are the bread bags recycled once we have collected them?

Our recycling partner APR Plastics manages the recycling process for us. APR Plastics empty the cartons and recycle the boxes. The plastic is then processed into an oil that can be reused to create food grade packaging, creating a circular economy.

Unfortunately the cardboard bread tags are not included as part of the Wonder Recycling Rewards program, but they can be recycled from home. To ensure your bread tags are properly recycled, pop them in a used paper envelope that's folded shut before throwing them in the paper recycling bin.

So let's all do our part to help protect our planet and earn some new sporting equipment for our school. Collect your bread bags at home and bring them to school to drop in the box.

It's as easy as that!

'Peaceful Kids' is a Mindfulness and Positive Psychology based program to lessen anxiety and stress and increase resilience in children. The program has been created to offer children a developmentally appropriate program that gives them the skills, practice and support to utilise coping strategies that lessen the symptoms of anxiety and stress.

#### Outcomes of the Peaceful Kids program:

- · Lessen symptoms of anxiety and stress in children
- · Teaches children to self-calm
- · Empowers children to manage their own anxiety and stress symptoms
- · Builds emotional resilience
- · Develops emotional intelligence skills
- · Teaches children life-long skills to manage stress and prevent stress build up
- · Supports children so they know that they are not alone with suffering from anxiety

#### **Program structure and fees:**

- · Foundation: 5 week program (60 mins each week). 4-6 students in each group.
- · Years 1-6: 8 week program (60 mins each week). 4-6 students in each group.
- · Sessions are run during class time (not during specialist classes).
- $\cdot$  Cost: \$200 (Foundation) \$270 (Years 1-6). This includes all materials for the 5/8 week program and weekly emails to parents.
- $\cdot$  10% discount for siblings and returning students.

### This program would suit:

- $\cdot$  Children who get stressed easily and/or have anxiety.
- $\cdot$  Children who find controlling their emotions difficult.
- · Any child who would like to learn more about mindfulness.


